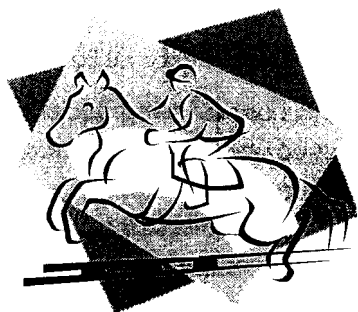

COMMUNITY INFORMATION

Yesterday morning at 7:15 a.m., I received a call from a Transportation client who is 94 years old. She asked if I could send someone over to sit with her. Upon questioning our client I found out that she has been receiving daily phone calls from a man who stated that she has won a lottery. The calls started two weeks ago, continued daily, ending with a call that he would be at her home today, to take her to her bank. I assured our client that this is a scam that I would call the Sherriff's office for her & ask for help. I told the client that this is not something that I would ask a volunteer to get involved in, that this is a matter for the Sherriff, not a volunteer. I told her many times to not answer the door unless she can see a Sherriff's car or a person with a badge. I then called the Sherriff's non-emergency number & explained the situation. A short time later I received a call back from the Sherriff's office that a Deputy was on the way that the Deputy had arrived & made contact with our client.

I called our client 1 hour later. She had received another call, asking her what color her dress is, that he was at the local Walgreens. I called the Sherriff's office again, urging a quick car to go to her home. Contacted client once again, to stay in the house, do not answer the door to anyone except a Deputy. The client was very afraid.

Today, the client assures me she is safe, that the Sherriff's officers watched her home for several hours & believe they can apprehend this one individual.

Unfortunately this is an ongoing operation all over the country. Is someone selling Senior names & phone numbers? Could it be a medical operation of some kind selling a list? Social Security agent?

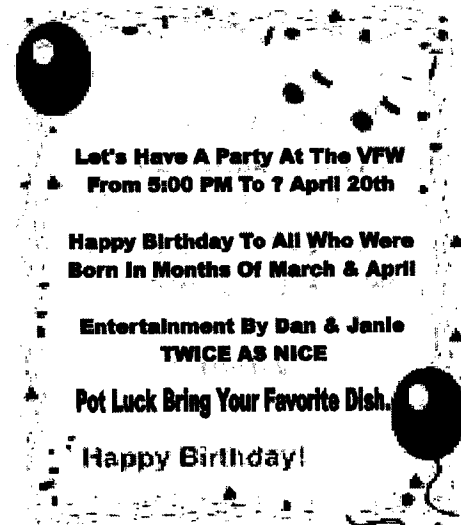

Food Bank

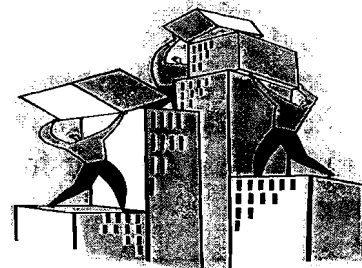
