




Town Board News

HVAC has been made fully functional with cost savings due to much better efficiency. Skip Piffer (certified in HVAC) did the work for far less than an outside contractor.

Public Comment: Jacqui Carr, of Indian Spring Towing brought to the attention of the Board that there is much confusion about the legal name of Farm Road, also known as Amargosa Farm Road, and the local post office is not sure either. A planning meeting will be scheduled to clarify this and the Board will decide at the next regular meeting.

Pam Webster, the new County Manager, and Vance Payne, the new Director of Emergency Services gave speeches outlying their desire to work with the Town instead of working against the Town.

Fireman/mechanic job description was approved for posting.

Fire department report showed improvement in the number of persons on the department and also an increase of average response.

Town vouchers were approved. Total expenditures \$8,142, not including payroll.

Decision was made to petition NDOT to lower the speed limit at the 373/95 junction to 45mph for one mile east and west of the junction.

Decision was made to approve a new contract with Nevada Health Centers for 13 months.

Decision was made to approve a letter of support for the reestablishment of the Jackass Flats Airport at Lathrop Wells. No cost to the Town.

Decision was made to purchase two red helmets and badges for the Fire Dept. Captains.

Decision was made to purchase five programmable thermostats for the Community Center.

A few of the August menu items are Meatball Subs, Fish Tacos, BBQ Beef Sandwiches, Chicken Fried Steak, and Pork Roast. See the entire menu elsewhere in this newsletter. Meals are served Monday through Friday from 4 to 5 p.m. except the second and fourth Fridays when we have breakfast.

If you're a senior and are unable to come to the center because of a disability or illness, please call us at 372-5413 for delivery of meals as part of our homebound program.

The Amargosa Senior Center is participating in a new program from Fund for Healthy Nevada to provide meals to low-income, disabled non-seniors (under 60 years old). This program will provide up to three meals per week at no cost to the participant. Applications for the new program are available at the Senior Center or the homebound delivery driver can drop them off for those who cannot come to the center.

The Senior Center sells ice--\$1 for a 5 pound bag. We also have Schwan's ice cream bars for \$1 each.

Open Pool is held every Friday starting at 5:30 p.m. Ladies Pool is the fourth Wednesday of each month at 5:30 p.m. You must be 18 years or older to play pool.

The Senior Center is located at 443 East Desert Senior Lane and is open from 1 to 5:30 weekdays. For more information call 372-5413.




Amargosa Amateur Radio Club



PERSEID METEOR SHOWER AUGUST 11/12

Meteor showers occur when the Earth travels through specks of dust and debris from comets or asteroids. These pieces of debris hit the earth's atmosphere at about 133,200 mph and burn up with flashes of light, or as we call them "shooting stars". Most meteor showers get their names from constellations from which they appear to streak. The Perseids appear to originate from Perseus.

Best viewed in the predawn hours, set your alarm for 2-4 AM on August 12. Get away from any light, ie. street lights etc. Get a comfortable chair or spread out a comfy blanket and pillow, relax and look towards the East.

This is a great family outing. Have some drinks and snacks to enjoy it even more.


