
Citizens of Amargosa Valley

The Amargosa Valley Town Board has taken a position opposing the 2014 Draft Resource Management Plan by the BLM and the removal of 800,000 acres around the Test Site by Senator Harry Reid. These proposed federal programs remove more public land from The Town of Amargosa Valley and Nye County. This further restricts our ability to grow and generate new jobs and restricts tourism.

This issue was discussed at the last AVTB meeting and it was suggested that it might garner more attention if more letters were written than just the one from the Town.

Pahrump Field Office Draft Resource Management Plan 2014

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The current Draft Resource Management Plan and the removal of 800,000 acres from the public (Surrounding the Nevada Test Site) do not provide a positive impact on the residents of Amargosa Valley.

The limiting of access to the Big Dune Recreation Area means that fewer people will be able to visit our area and use these facilities. This will result in a drop in tourism and revenue for our local stores and hotels.

Ash Meadows Wildlife Refuge should be opened up and made more accessible to the public. But a ¼ mile barrier is being placed around the facility and will further restrict access. The BLM and US Fish and Wildlife seem to have their own Agenda for this facility. Amargosa Valley is just starting to attract a growing number of international tourists to the site and in fact our local hotel has had to increase staff but that will now be in jeopardy. Amargosa Valley desperately needs every job we can create .

Mr. Reid's plan to remove 800,000 acres from public access around the Nevada Test Site further restricts the ability of this facility to grow and produce more scientific and technologically advanced jobs. The facilities on the Test Site should be expanded and promoted. The Amargosa Valley greatly benefited from the jobs that were provided by contractors on the Test Site and we would like to see that facility open and operating at capacity.

Please review the entire picture when voting on these propositions. The local economies and jobs depend upon them being open and accessible.
