IN MEMORIAM RUBY HAPPEL-HOLTZ

Beloved author and artist, Ruby Happel-Holtz died in Las Vegas on May 11th. Ruby was born in Mt. Vernon, Indiana. She attended "Lockyears Business School" in Indianapolis, Indiana, "Herron Art Institute" also in Indiana and the "Community College of Brevard County" in Florida. She retired from a career in "Space Technology" at Cape Kennedy, one of highlights of which was working on the "moon shuttle". She also had careers in "interior design and market research".

Ruby was unaware of her rich "Indian" heritage until she was 59, at that time she retired to extensively research this heritage and write her first book "Unconquered Hearts" a true life story written in novel form in 2003. Her second book "Wings of Change" was a continuation of "Unconquered Hearts" spanning the years of 1894 to 1987. In 2011 her third book "Kool Kat Charlie of Cocoa Beach" an adult/children's book was published. Shortly before her death she was meeting to negotiate 2 of her books being made into movies, "Unconquered Hearts" and "Kool Kat Charlie". Unfortunately that meeting did not take place as she had a serious fall that hospitalized her. She was recovering at her daughter's home in Las Vegas at the time of her death.

In 1998 Ruby retired to Pahrump where she met the late Charles Holtz of Amargosa, they married in 2000 and she moved to Amargosa Valley. She continued her writing and artwork there. Ruby's paintings have graced the cover of the "Amargosa Valley" telephone books for several years. A very special lady that leaves a big hole in our community.

Ruby had 4 children, 9 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren.

THINGS TO DO IN AND AROUND THE VALLEY

SEKHMETT'S TEMPLE

Heading down highway 95 and just before you get to "Indian Springs" there is a little wide spot in the road, called "Cactus Springs". If you glance to the right you will see off in the distance a small temple with entwined rods on the roof. Very curious about it, one day a few of us stopped to check it out. It is small temple dedicated to the goddess "Sekhmett".

The temple was built by Genevieve Vaughn. In 1965 while visiting Egypt she saw the goddess and was told that "women who want to get pregnant should make a promise to her" Genevieve did and the promise was to "build her a temple". She did get pregnant. In 1993 she made good her promise. The land the temple is on originally belonged to the Western Shoshone and the US government had promised to give them back the land in the "Ruby Valley Treaty of 1863, of course they never did. Genevieve bought the land and returned it to them and now rents the area back from them for the temple and its grounds.

The Temple houses a statue of "Sekhmett" which has the head of a lion and body of a woman. I guess I would call the temple and its beliefs "new age". There is great reverence for the land and for women. There are many "Sacred Art Trails" surrounding the site with small alters scattered along the way, each devoted to one of "Sekhmett's" many names, "One Who Holds Back the Dark", "Bountiful One". "Sekhmett" has over 4,000 names.

There are "Full Moon" gatherings along with a "potluck".

The grounds also have a guest cottage that can be booked for free. There are many other activities too numerous to mention. It's a delightful place to visit and wander the trails. You might run into the current "Priestess" Candace Ross who has lived here since 2007.

ENHANCE YOUR YARD


With very little money and effort you can add color and interest to your yard. I love garage sales and pick up lots of glass and ceramic items to use to make totem, stick items etc.

This is a large vase that I got at a garage sale topped with a blue and white ceramic egg. I simply glued the egg to the vase. I use "goop" or a "clear silicone adhesive" you can get at most hardware stores. I also glue the piece to a small concrete block that I've planted in the ground, sometimes I sprinkle glass stones at the base for extra color.

This is an ugly lamp that I got at a garage sale for \$1.00, I removed the electrical components (easy to do) sprayed it with a primer then with a bright green color. It's about 3 ft. tall so makes a bold statement. I plan to glue a large plate or bowl on top to use as a bird-feeder or birdbath. I will fill the base with sand for added weight. So simple, cheap and easy.

Another decoration that I've made is taking a piece of 4ft. rebar, sinking it about 1 ft. into the ground and topping it with a decoration I've made out of a teacup, teapot or small figurine. I use a vase or wine bottle and glue the item to it, then hang it on rebar.

With a few dollars, a little bit of time, you can add color and fun to your yard.


Amargosa Amateur Radio Club

What if your spouse is having a heart attack and you have to wait forty minutes for an ambulance to get here from Beatty. Does this sound bleak? It is my friends! This is the time we all need to be drawing closer together serving each other and our neighbors by giving back to the community. Could you find it in your heart to be a volunteer? Maybe you were one in the past and you have experienced the ghost look and don't feel valuable enough to help. I am here to say to those who are no longer volunteering you are missed!

"There is no greater gift a man can give than to give his life for another". Neighbors we need your help now, today! Please find it in your heart to volunteer or rejoin the services. Change begins within us first. Start a different kind of virus, one that does good for your fellow man.
