First of all, I would like to let everyone know that our 2008 Summer Reading Program is underway, due to start effective June 2nd, 2008. It will end on August 24th, the day before school starts. Here are the highlighted events:

Daily, we will have Story Hour from 11am till 12 Noon.

Weekly, we will offer incentives to the children who participate and read for us.

They will, depending on the reader, read either 1 to 2 Books and/or 100 to 500 pages.

Monthly, there will be bigger incentives for the active readers of Amargosa Elementary school, as well as two large programs. Please do NOT remove the protective plastic slip placed over the DVD. They work with this item on them and it protects from scratches.

If you notice that a DVD you have borrowed is defective, please DO notify the Library immediately.

Please note: DVD's are more fragile then you might believe them to be. It's only fair that everyone keeps them in as good condition as possible so that others may enjoy them, too.

We will see what happens in the coming months, but if this continues, we will have to start charging for DVD's that are returned in less then satisfactory condition.

Following is a reprise of a "Corner" that appeared in the August 2006, newsletter. It doesn't seem possible that Earlene has been gone almost two years. But she has. And the Fire Department and the EMTs still desperately need new members, especially you youngsters (aged 45 and under). Not everyone can do these things, but some of you can. If you are smart, and strong and loving, they will train you. And, you, too, could become and angel!

"Amargosa Valley recently lost one of its angels. Most of you already know that, because almost half of you attended the funeral of Earlene Settlemire. By referring to her as an angel, I don't mean to imply that she was perfect. Earlene would never have claimed that designation. She was intelligent, hard-working, opinionated, and probably a little stubborn. She was also a dedicated EMT who had been part of our emergency services for many, many years: hence the "angel" designation.

Being an EMT or a fire fighter in Amargosa Valley is very difficult. Your life isn't your own because you are almost always on call. While others are enjoying Christmas dinner with their families, you are out putting out a fire and saving buildings and lives caused by someone's Christmas tree. Or you're on I95 taking care of people in an accident on the way to their family for the holiday. Instead of attending your son or daughter's special school event, you are driving someone to town that fell off a ladder or had an appendicitis attack or other problem. You get to spend your weekends sliding down the Big Dune rescuing some idiot who tried to fly in an ATV and hit some other idiot "flying" from the other side. In the heat of the summer, you are in Ash Meadows fighting a brush fire to

protect the Amargosa residents who live nearby.

You have to see strangers and friends and, sometimes, family, in the throes of serious illness or injury or death. And you have to pretend that they are all strangers and do what you have to do to try to save their lives.

No, being an EMT or Fire Fighter is certainly not easy. But those wonderful people who do both tell me that it is rewarding. Certainly not in money: they are not paid. The only real compensations are a job well done: a fire put out, a building or vehicle saved, a life saved. It takes a special kind of person to do these jobs. And they are all angels.


