MEDICAL INFORMATION

One in 8 women will develop breast cancer. One in 6 men over 50 will develop prostate cancer.

More women die from breast cancer than men from prostate cancer.

Breast cancer grows faster and is more difficult to treat.

We have had more than 2 prostate cancer deaths in this area in the last 12 months. Most adults know of a man who has died from prostate cancer.

Prostate cancer is easy to prevent: a yearly health check which includes a PSA exam will detect the cancer and an active surveillance should be pursued.

Fortunately, many prostate cancers are slow growing, and, while being under active surveillance, the individual will die from some disease related to old age. Others, that have a rapid growing cancer, require active treatment. There are now 5 active treatments, one of which includes prostate removal. Some of the other treatments are just as effective, but have fewer side effects. Ten years ago there were only 2 choices: removal of the prostate gland or radiation. Blacks and Latinos are more susceptible. The cures for prostate cancer may have side effects, such as impotence (erectile dysfunction) and urinary incontinence. These are minor inconveniences compared to a prostate death, which is not rapid and is very painful.

NOTE: Many men over 50 years of age find that they are getting up at night to urinate, sometimes several times. This is usually caused by an enlarged prostate which continues to grow throughout a man's lifetime. This is not usually cancer. It is important to get a diagnosis by an M.D. as these problems can be treated by medication and/or surgery.
