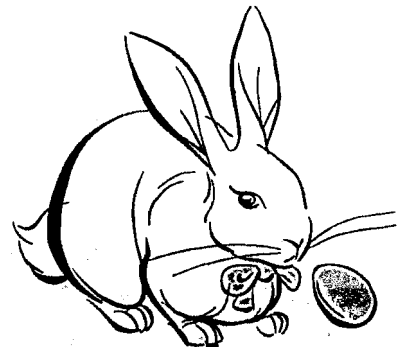

The Amargosa Senior Center is on its way to having a “new” facility, thanks to the County and its acquisition of a 3,600 square foot modular building at the Test Site. Kudos to all those who have helped clean out the building, dismantle furniture, and prepare the building for moving to Amargosa.

DOE personnel, County employees, and a Senior Center Building Committee work crew have done an outstanding job coordinating and accomplishing the activities necessary to bring this project forward. The Building Committee especially appreciates financial contributions from local residents that have made this project possible.

Tentative (very tentative!) plans are for site work to begin in March; possibly moving the building in April; and interior remodel on into May and June. Long ways to go, but the Building Committee and enthusiastic seniors are moving ahead!
