Don't forget that the Senior Thrift Store is open on Wednesdays from 1-5 p.m. and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.


The Senior Center is located at 443 E. Desert Senior Lane and is open from 1 to 5:30 weekdays.

### It is that time of year to remember how important it is to support our graduates.

All scholarship funds are paid directly to accredited institutions and not to the students directly.

We hope you will contribute to our Scholarship Fund. Please make checks payable to: <u>Amargosa Beatty H. S. Scholarship Fund</u>. Checks may be mailed to the address above or given to a member of the Scholarship Committee. Graduation is June 7, 2013 at 7:00 pm at the Beatty High School. Donations need to be in by May 20, 2013 so that we will know how many scholarships we will be able to award.


