AMARGOSA VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Amargosa Volunteer Fire Dept. is in need of your support in an on-going fight to protect you and the volunteer firefighters themselves. Some questions were raised at the September 23rd special BOCC meeting in Amargosa Valley regarding your fire department. We hope the following information will shed some light on just a few of the reasons for the frustration you may have witnessed at the meeting.

As you know the Amargosa VFD lost our main work horse of our fleet in March of this year due to a catastrophic mechanical failure while fighting a structure fire. What the community as a whole does not know is the on-going battle being waged to keep you as safe as we possibly can. Since then the

Chief and our town board have attempted to get a replacement tender through Nye County Emergency Services unsuccessfully.

We have all been met with opposition and the usual political shuffle. Without our tender we are reliant on an old tender we were able to obtain from Smoky Valley with the help of Commissioner Eastley. Although destined for the bone yard, we have done the best that we can to restore it to a functioning tender, but on the second run with it after our main tender burned, it broke down. Thanks to Ponderosa Dairy, their mechanics and our Chief were able to get it fixed in a couple of hours. That was a 300 ton hay fire we were fighting, though that was a lot of money lost for the Dairy it wasn't someone's home. If it had been, there could have been loss of life.

We have decided it was time to let the people of our community know the struggles that your Town Board and your Fire Chief have been through to try and protect you and the lives of the volunteer firefighters. We would also like you to remember that Amargosa is at the highest tax rate in Nye County.

Under the direction of Brent Jones the Nye County Emergency Services Station 51 in Pahrump has continued to grow in size and budget. The organization was created in 1994 under Nye County Code Chapter 8.28. Among the duties and functions of the emergency management supervisor are: to develop arrangements for reciprocal aid for assistance in the case of disaster too great to be dealt with unassisted...promote and provide for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens...including the development of a county emergency response plan and emergency management training education programs and exercises. Since then it has built an extensive fully equipped fire department at 1510 East Siri Lane in Pahrump which is already protected by Pahrump Valley Fire Rescue. From Fiscal Year 2006 through FY08 the budget has grown from \$566,200 to \$1,034,093 while its support to the local fire depts. has decreased.

It is also attempting to exercise increasing control over local fire departments and their members. Among other things, it recently tried to create a County Fire Protection District without due process of the law.

In brief, a Fire Protection District is a political subdivision of the state and may sue and be sued, arbitrate claims, contract and be contracted with, organize, regulate, and disband volunteer fire depts., eliminate and remove fire hazards on private or public premises, levy taxes to fund itself, issue and sell bonds, etc.

It is formed by a vote of the citizens and governed by an elected board, not an appointed official. The Board of County Commissioners also has the power to create by ordinance a County Fire Protection Dist. in unincorporated areas and serve as the Board of Fire Commissioners.

Nye County Emergency Services has also demanded that our local run reports be turned over to them to bolster their run statistics. Some fire depts. in the county are doing as they are told,

we are not. We began filing our own run reports with the State under our own NFIRS (National Fire Incident Reporting System) number as does Tonopah and Pahrump Valley Fire rescue. You can view the results of these reports on the State Fire Marshal's website at http://fire.state.nv.us/Fire Data NFIRS.shtml, choose a year and click on NFIRS Annual Report.

Keep in mind the runs for Nye County includes the total runs of all the departments that are turning over their reports to Nye Co Emergency Services. Also note how they change their name from 2007 to 2008 as we began exposing the Fire District issue.

A quick comparison shows Nye County Emergency Management at 72 total runs for 2008, with a FY08 budget of \$1,034,093, while Amargosa VFD comes in at 98 runs, with a FY08 budget of \$95,958.

In summary, AVFD is proud to serve our friends, family, and neighbors, however we feel that huge sums of taxpayer moneis are being wasted at the expense of the safety of our rural citizens.

P.S. As this was written, an article appeared in the Sept 25 issue of the Pahrump Valley Times which incorrectly states that the Board of County Commissioners approved \$25,000 in "matching funds" for the purchase of a replacement water tender for Amargosa Valley. What the BOCC actually approved was to allow the Town of Amargosa Valley to use \$15,000 of its capital outlay fund to go along with \$10,000 in private donations towards the purchase of a water tender.

TOWN BOARD ELECTIONS

It is that time of year again. The terms of Jan Cameron and Aaron Lynn expire at the end of December. NOMINATIONS for those two positions will be held at the regular meetings on September 24 and October 29. The ELECTION will be held on November 19, with the individuals elected starting their terms January 1, 2010.

NOMINATIONS for the special election will also be held at the September 24 meeting. The SPECIAL ELECTION will also be held on October 29.

Individuals must be present to accept nomination. Alternately, you may have sent a signed letter or an email sent from your personal account to the Town Office (<u>town@amargosavalley.com</u>) in which you accept being nominated. Failure to do one of those things will result in your nomination not being accepted.

In order to serve on the Town Advisory Board or to vote in the special or regular election, you must meet all of the following criteria:

- 1) Be a US Citizen;
- 2) Be at least 18 years of age;
- 3) Not have a felony conviction on your record; and
- 4) Have resided in Amargosa Valley for at least 30 days prior to your nomination or the election.
- 5) Be registered to vote with the County or the Town.

If you are already registered to vote in general elections at this precinct with the County, you do not need to do anything except show up to vote. If you are not registered to vote in general elections, but have previously registered with the Town Office and still meet the criteria, you do not need to do anything except show up to vote.

If you meet the criteria, but have not yet registered in either of those ways, you must register with the County or the Town 30 days prior to your nomination, if you want to run for office, or the election, if you plan to vote.

Serving on the Town Advisory Board requires a lot more than just sitting in a chair at the table once a month. Please be sure that you will have the time and energy to serve if you choose to run.
