Some notes from the Chairman:

- Some important items are still under consideration by the Town Board.
 1. How to address and modify Town Ordinance #1, The Fire Department Ordinance. The issue is that of prior felons being allowed to serve on the Amargosa Volunteer Fire Department. The Board is seeking more input about this issue from the residents of this valley.
 2. How to address the present and future employees of the Town regarding their duties & responsibilities. This item is ever-important as it directly affects the Town Budget for years to come. While we have a sound budget now, it is important that we continue to build a financial carry-over which is to be used to be able to contend with issues that may arise that cannot be foreseen, and also to be used for development of possible future Town projects and infrastructure. The Board is seeking continued input from the residents on this issue as well. As representatives of you, the residents of this Valley, the Board is always looking for and encourages ideas and input on anything and everything that is of concern to you.
ALSO: At the next Town Board Meeting on October 18, 2012, all candidates who are running for the Board on the November 6, 2012 election are encouraged to give a speech and mingle with the attendees of the meeting.
AND: www.avnvusa.net was adopted as the official Town WebSite. Here again, we welcome suggestions for pages and content from you, the residents, to be placed on the site.

Committees of the Town Board

The purpose of the committees are to get additional input from the residents on how to get ideas and suggestions to the Board.

Presently the following committees exist:

1. Human Resources
2. Planning
3. Tourism and Economic Development
4. Cemetery
5. Memorial Support

Some committees have Town Board Members on them and some don't. There is no requirement in the bylaws that a Board Member be on any committee with the exception that in the event of a lack of a quorum for a committee meeting, the Chairman of the Board may participate and vote on items on the committee's agenda.

Some committees are made up of dedicated people who've served for a long time, and some committees do not have enough members to perform the functions of the committee.

Any person may ask to be considered for membership of a committee, and right now we need to fill some of the committees so that they may function. The standard number of persons on each committee is five, however that is not law, and there may be more than five.

PLEASE UNDERSTAND THIS:

By Nevada State Law, committees of the Town Board (or even an advisory board) are subject to all the same Open Meeting Law Requirements of the Town Board.

Cat Neutering, \$10
Domestic and Feral

Volunteers will help you to get your cats "fixed" for a minimal fee paid to Heaven Can Wait in Vegas. Each cat costs \$30 for surgery and shots, but we are fortunate to have an anonymous donor who is covering \$20 per cat. The clinic happens once per month.

If you want domestic cats fixed, we will come and get the cat from you the day before the clinic and the cat would be gone over 2 nights.

If you have a feral colony, we will come to trap any cats that we can. Those cats will go through the same time frame and be returned to your property upon return to the Valley. This allows feral cats to live out their lives without reproducing and overpopulating.

The \$10 is required by Heaven Can Wait. Any donations for gasoline to get your cat(s) in and around the Valley, and to ferry him/her to Vegas for clinic would be very welcome.

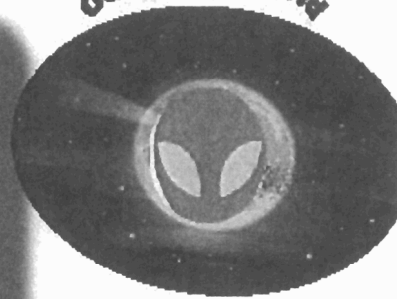

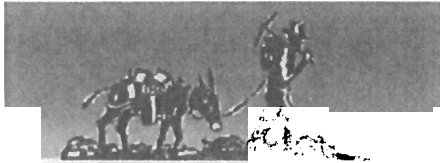
Senior Center News

Update on the Senior Center program for disabled non-seniors: the Healthy Nevada Fund grant will now cover the costs of **five meals per week** for low-income, disabled non-seniors. Participants may come to the Senior Center for meals or, if homebound, have meals delivered.

Sandy Jennings, State Health Insurance Assistance representative, will be at Amargosa's Senior Center in November to help answer your questions about Medicare and related insurance.
