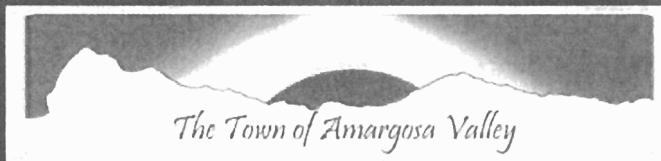

Local resident provides pitting services for Off-Road racers

Last Friday was the annual running of the Best in the Desert, Vegas to Reno Off-road race. 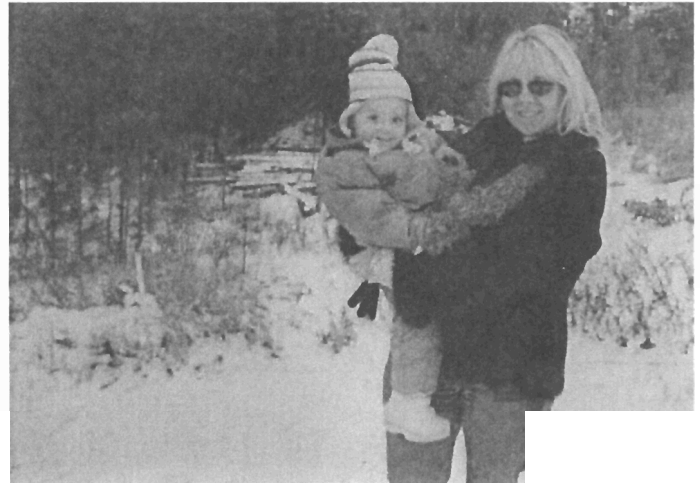

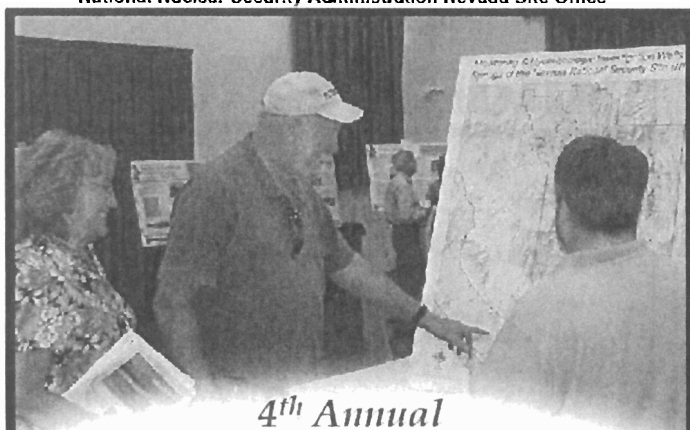

GROUND WATER OPEN HOUSE

For several years I was a member of a community advisory board that reviewed environmental projects on the Nevada Test Site. My main focus was contamination of ground-water resources from legacy underground nuclear testing, a difficult problem to get a handle on due to the size of the area, and the complexity of the local environment. In recent years they have come a long way in expanding their understanding of the problem through drilling and pump-testing wells.

During this process they learned that contamination had migrated off the test site, although only as far as U.S. Air force lands so far. Recognizing community interest and concern, they held an open house in Beatty, closest neighbor to the contamination. People could talk one-on-one with scientists and engineers about their questions and concerns. They provided posters to illustrate what they had learned. There was so much community interest that they have held the event annually in Beatty ever since.

This year they decided to bring the most recent information to Amargosa. The event is in open-house style, so you can see the exhibits and ask questions at your own pace. There will also be representatives from Nye County, the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection and the Nevada Division of Water Resources to discuss questions or concerns.

If you have any concerns or are interested in better understanding contamination impacts on groundwater upstream of Amargosa water, please take advantage of this opportunity. It's a great chance to learn and to voice your concerns to the Department of Energy. See flyer on this page for details.

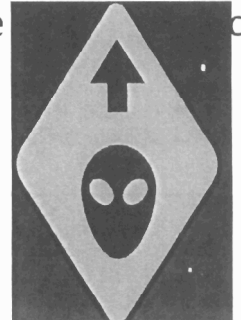

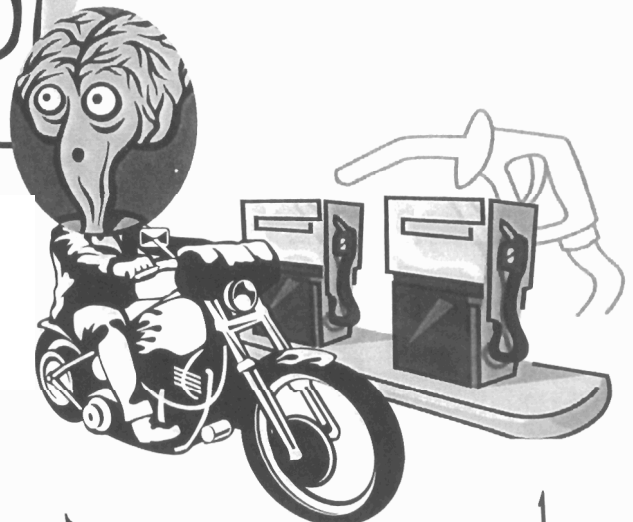
